Spokane County collects tax dollars on behalf of the City of Spokane Valley and small cities, towns and rural areas throughout the county collectively committed to using these funds efficiently through a Comprehensive Homelessness Response System that:

Regional investments through the Continuum of Care (CoC) **= \$6.3M**

In addition, Spokane County and the City of Spokane Valley also partner with the City of Spokane, which serves as the lead agency for the regional CoC, coordinating recruitment and distribution of federal HUD funding for countywide homelessness services.

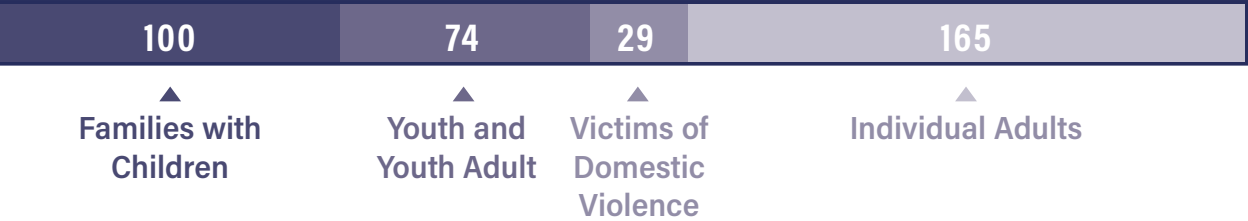

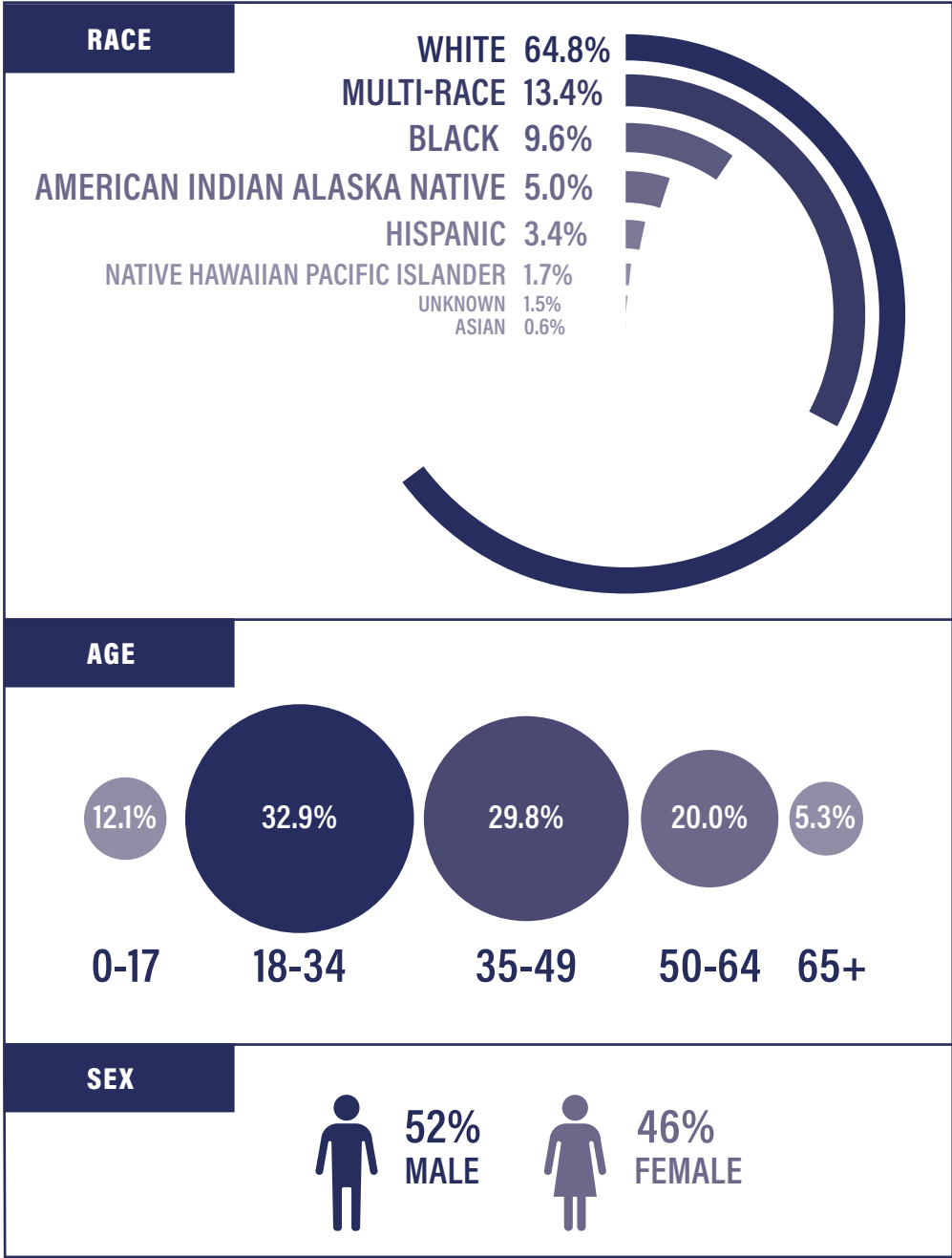
